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CNA Role in Documentation When the patient functions below their capability for a prolonged period of time, functional losses may become permanent Documentation may help to qualify the beneficiary for long-term care, if needed For example, a patient inaccurately coded as independent may not qualify for additional care in the facility.

Skilled Documentation Examples of Nursing Documentation: Left lateral calf wound healing as evidenced by decrease in size and amount of drainage from last week. Wound now 0.2 cm x 0.5 cm. No drainage at this time. Condition improving as evidenced by now able to ambulate entire distance to dining room for meals with no rest periods required.

Effective with the implementation of PDPM on October 1, 2019, the documentation burden will begin to shift to nursing as patients entering skilled nursing facilities from acute care are admitted with the presumption of coverage for skilled nursing services.
